

**Tuesday, February 10, 2009** – The Committee held a **business meeting** to adopt the Committee's Oversight Plan for the 111<sup>th</sup> Congress; approve a resolution by Ranking Member Barton to establish the Republican membership on the five standing subcommittees; and approve a motion by Chairman Waxman that the Committee direct the Chairman to execute and issue a subpoena to Stewart Parnell, Owner and President of Peanut Corporation of America, to testify on February 11, 2009, before the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations of the Committee on Energy and Commerce. The Subcommittee seeks Mr. Stewart's testimony regarding the recent *Salmonella* outbreak associated with peanut products manufactured by Peanut Corporation of America. The motion to issue the subpoena was agreed to by a voice vote.

**Wednesday, February 11, 2009** – **S. 352**, the DTV Delay Act, was signed by the President and became *Public Law 111-4*.

**Friday, February 13, 2009** – The conference report resolving differences between the House and the Senate on H.R. 1, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, passed the House by a record vote of 246 – 183.

**Tuesday, February 17, 2009** – **H.R. 1**, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, was signed by the President and became *Public Law 111-5*.


