- (2) **H.R. 3019**, the Spectrum Relocation Improvement Act of 2009, was ordered favorably reported to the House by a voice vote.
- (3) **H.R. 1258**, the Truth in Caller ID Act of 2010, as amended by the Subcommittee on Communications, Technology, and the Internet on October 8, 2009. The Committee ordered H.R. 1258 favorably reported, to the House, amended, by a voice vote.

There were no full Committee hearings held during this month.

OTHER ACTIONS BY THE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND COMMERCE IN MARCH 2010

Sunday, March 21, 2010 – *Final passage of the healthcare reform legislation:* The House acted on the Senate amendments to H.R. 3590, the healthcare reform legislation, the bill that was considered in lieu of H.R. 3200, reported by the Committee on Energy and Commerce and H.R. 3962, passed by the House on November 7, 2009. The House concurred in the Senate amendments to H.R. 3590, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, by a roll call vote: 219 – 212. H.R. 3590 was signed into law on March 23, 2010, (*Public Law 111-148*).

The House also agreed to H.R. 4872, the Reconciliation Act of 2010, by a roll call vote of 220 – 211. The bill made a number of health-related financial and revenue changes to the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (*P.L. 111-148*). H.R. 4871 was signed in to law on March 30, 2010, (*Public Law 111-152*).
