ACTIVITIES IN THE COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND COMMERCE DURING APRIL 2010:

Wednesday, April 15, 2010 – The Committee met in open **markup** session on the following bills and resolution:

- (1) **H.R. 5026**, the “Grid Reliability and Infrastructure Defense Act” or the “GRID Act”, was considered and ordered favorably reported to the House, amended, by a roll call vote: 47 – 0.
- (2) **H.R. 5019**, the “Home Star Energy Retrofit Act of 2010”, was ordered favorably reported to the House, amended, by a roll call vote: 30 – 17.
- (3) **A Republican resolution** making certain changes in Republican membership on several subcommittees was agreed to by unanimous consent of the Committee. The Resolution included adding Mr. Sullivan of Oklahoma to the Subcommittee on Health and made subcommittee assignments to a new Member of the Committee, Robert E. Latta of Ohio. Pursuant to H. Res. 1223, Mr. Latta was elected on March 25, 2010, to serve on the Committee, filling the vacancy created by the resignation of Hon. Nathan Deal (R-GA) from the House of Representatives on March 21, 2010. The resolution further appointed Mr. Shimkus of Illinois to serve as Republican Ranking Member of the Subcommittee on Health for the One Hundred Eleventh Congress.

There were no hearings held by the full Committee during this month.

The Subcommittee on Commerce, Trade, and Consumer Protection held the following hearings and markups during the month of April 2010:

Wednesday, April 28, 2010 – The Subcommittee **held** a hearing on “Public Sales of Hurricane Katrina/Rita FEMA Trailers: Are they Safe or Environmental Time Bombs?” The hearing discussed public sales by the General Services Administration (GSA) of travel trailers and mobile homes that were purchased and provisioned by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as emergency housing for thousands of displaced Gulf Coast residents following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

Thursday, April 29, 2010 – The Subcommittee held a legislative **hearing** on “H.R. _____, the Consumer Product Safety Enhancement Act.” This hearing will focus on draft legislation designed to address several issues that have been raised regarding in implementing the Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008, enacted last Congress to strengthen and modernize the consumer product safety system in the United States, with a particular emphasis on improving safety of products designed or intended for children.
