

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COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND COMMERCE

ACTIVITY REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE 2009

The Committee on Energy and Commerce conducted the following hearings and meetings during the month of June 2009:

Wednesday, June 10, 2009 – The Committee met in open **markup** session and considered two resolutions of inquiry:

H. Res. 462, a resolution of inquiry requesting that the President transmit to the House of Representatives all information in his possession relating to specific communications with Chrysler LLC. H. Res. 452 was ordered reported to the House without amendment and without recommendation by a voice vote; and

H. Res. 449, a resolution of inquiry requesting the President to provide certain documents in his possession to the House of Representatives relating to the Environmental Protection Agency's April proposed finding that greenhouse gas emissions are a danger to public health and welfare. H. Res. 449 was ordered reported to the House without amendment and without recommendation by a voice vote.

Wednesday, June 17, 2009 – The Committee met in open **markup** session to consider and order **H.R. 2749**, the Food Safety Enhancement Act of 2009, favorably reported to the House, amended, by a voice vote.

Wednesday, June 24, 2009 – The Committee held a joint legislative **hearing** with the Subcommittee on Health entitled "Health Care Reform Draft Proposal, Day 2." The hearing witness was the Hon. Kathleen Sebelius, Secretary of Health and Human Services.

The following legislative actions of the Committee on Energy and Commerce also occurred during the month of June 2009:

Friday, June 5, 2009 – The Committee on Energy and Commerce filed the House report on **H.R. 2454**, the "American Clean Energy and Security Act of 2009", (House Report 111-137, Part 1).

Friday, June 26, 2009 – **H.R. 2454**, the American Clean Energy and Security Act of 2009, amended, passed the House by a recorded vote of 219 to 212.

H.R. 2190, the Mercury Pollution Reduction Act, was considered and forwarded favorably to the full Committee, amended, by a roll call vote of 16 – 10.
